# **Superintendents Report**

Montana Cares app: This is a pilot app for 3 years at no cost to district. Students can access resources if they're struggling mentally, can contact crisis center, contact Superintendent and/or Janice anonymously to send screenshots, etc. if bullying is happening.

Jeanine and the Board received emails about the State targeting our middle school as needing additional academic support and improvement. There is a meeting on April 5 to get more details. MTSS has a 3-day training in Bozeman this summer with a grant for teachers to attend.

Technology: teacher laptops are at end of life. Jeanine will purchase new at the end of the school year to get them ready for next year. Summer projects: Title I room clean-up wires, wiring in Jeanine's office, front entry camera.

Jeanine may offer a summer book study for teachers to replace MEA days/OPI credits.

Graduation is May 21 at 1:00pm. Prom is March 24, breathalyzer test entering prom. Child Find screening April 5-6.

Current legislation regarding education: health trust bill – statewide school health insurance plan, more local control for districts, trustees term changes, possibly know funding for next year by end of current year, 549 and 562 regarding charter schools. 549 includes title 20 rights for kids.

Kindergarten – accept 4 year olds? Our current policy follows state guidelines for cutoff dates. The school would not get funding if we accept a 4-year-old.

Possible spring program dates: May 8: 7-12 band at 6:30pm, May 9: K-3 at 2:50pm, May 11: 4-6 band 3:00pm.
