
Nashua 7th graders put on Mini Pre-school


Third Grade Supports Boys' Tournament

Lady Porcupines End Season at Districts

On February 19th the girls headed to the 3-C district tournament in Malta. The Nashua Porcupines were matched up with the Hinsdale Raiders in the opening round. The Nashua Porcupines were defeated by the Hinsdale Raiders 32-31. The Lady Porcupines ended with first half with 11 while the Raiders had 9. The second half the Porcupines had 20 and the Raiders had 23. Leading scorers for the Nashua Porcupines were Rachel McMurry with 11, followed by Kassidi Sibley with 7, Cami Rosencrans with 6, Jana Tihista with 4, and Hannah McMurry added 3.

In loser-out action, the Lady Porcupines defeated the Lustre Lions 37-12. The Porcupines ended the first half with 21 points and the Lions had 7. In the second half, the Porcupines had 16 and the Lions had 5. Leading scorers for the Nashua Porcupines were Jennifer Ramsbacher and Rachel McMurry both with 9, Darbi Borgen with 7, followed by McKenzie Clampitt, Tihista, Sibley, Freia Henz, Alexa Barnes and Mary Damon with 2 a piece.

With the winning moving on to divisionals, Nashua played Scobey. The Lady Porcupines were defeated by the Lady Spartans, 43-35. The Porcupines were outscored in the first half, 22-17, but the second half the Porcupines had 20 points and the Spartans had 21. Leading scorers for the Nashua Porcupines were Rachel McMurry with 12, Borgen with 7, Tihista with 6, Sibley with 4, Hannah McMurry with 3, Barnes with 2, and Ramsbacher added one.



Nashua Out in Two at Divisionals

Nashua boys opened up the Divisional tournament in Malta against the Culbertson Cowboys. At the end of the first quarter the game was all tied up at 10 points. In the second quarter Nashua couldn't hit a shot and only scored 4 points, and Culbertson took advantage and scored 13 points at the end of the second quarter to take a 23 to 14 half-time lead. Nashua comes out of the locker room with some fire scoring 15 points in the third Nashua to close up the gap, 31 to 29 in favor of Culbertson.

The Porcupines got a quick lead on the Cowboys in the fourth and forced Culbertson to foul. Nashua knocked down the free throws and seemed to be in control of the game, but sparked by a 5-point play, Culbertson made a furious comeback taking the win 57 to 53 sending Nashua to the consolation bracket.

High scorer was Brandon Hansard with 18 points. Sean Bengochea had 12 points. Anthony Bengochea scored 11 points, Shae Stein and Dustin Kelm both with 5, and Wilbert Ackerman with 2.

With the tough loss to Culbertson, Nashua had a tough time getting going against Scobey in loser-out action and were defeated 50-29. The end of the first quarter came and Nashua was up 7 to 6. After the first quarter Scobey started to hit their shots and took the lead, 18 to 14, going into the locker rooms. The Nashua were outscored 15-7 in the third quarter putting them even farther behind, 21-33.

Scobey held the ball the rest of the game for the trip to divisional. This was the seniors last game in their high school careers. Hansard and Ackerman were the leading scorer with 13 and 10 points respectively. Dustin Kelm add 3 points with Shae Stein with 1 and Dustin Kelm with 3 to round out the scoring.
