The FCCLA State Convention took place in Billings from Thursday, March 18th to Saturday, March, 20th. Nashua's representatives were FCCLA president Jost Smolarski, vice-president Shae Stein, secretary Kassidi Sibley, treasurer Ryan Dahl, reporter Jen Ramsbacher, as well as Dillon Fisher, Anthony Bengochea, Jayde Clampitt, Freia Henz, Dustin Kelm, and the Nashua FCCLA advisor Mrs. Hanson. Chaperone for this trip was Jamie Lauckner; Dewy was the bus driver.

"I had a lot of fun competing in my event and having the dance-off with Jost," said NHS sophomore Jen Ramsbacher. The bus left on Thursday morning at 7 o'clock and arrived in Billings at around 12:30 p.m. The FCCLA members checked in at the Kelly Inn. All official FCCLA activities proceeded in the Billings Hotel, the Holiday Inn, and the Billings Convention Center. The former Montana FCCLA Executive Council welcomed all participants (more than 700 students) on Thursday and introduced the new council.

On Friday each "Star/Proficiency Event" participant presented his or her event to judges who graded the project. The dance followed that same evening. On Saturday, students were honored with medals or certificates during the Award Ceremony.

"I had an awesome weekend! It was so much fun to meet all these new people from throughout the state. I really appreciate that I have been able to do that," said Jost Smolarski.

For Nashua Dahl and Henz got silver for their "Child Care/Service Learning Center" project as well as Smolarski for his "Career Investigation" project; bronze medals went to Sibley and Fisher for their "Chapter Showcase Manual"; Ramsbacher and Clampitt for their "Interior Design" project; Stein for his "Consumer Event" as well as Bengochea and Kelm for their "Focus on Children" project. Mrs. Hanson also received an award for her 15 years of service as a FCCLA advisor.

NHS Rocks Math Contest

On March 15th was the annual math contest was held in Glasgow with over 200 students from northeastern Montana participating. Nashua students had a good showing at the contest with many earning superiors (highest) and some earning honorable mention. The contest consisted of students in grades 7-12 taking individual tests as well as collaborating on team tests.

Freshman Sean Bengochea and Sophomore Cami Rosencrans were the top Nashua mathletes. Sean received the highest score on the Problem Solving as well as Honorable Mention on two tests: Applied Math and Dimensions and Shapes. Rosencrans received superiors on two tests: Intermediate and Problem Solving.

"The Nashua students did very well. I am very proud of their great behavior and their great jobs on the tests," stated Ms. Canen, NHS math instructor.

Also receiving superiors were 7th grader Ryan Scanlan (Number Concepts), ChyAnn Clampitt (Potluck), Gauge Ackerman (Applied Math), and Anthony Bengochea (Finite). The team of Gauge Ackerman, Hannah McMurry, and Cami Rosencrans also earned a superior on the 9th and 10th grade team test.

Receiving honorable mentions were Ryan Scanlan, ChyAnn Clampitt, Madison Sibley, Hannah McMurry, Sean Bengochea, Jared Busch, Taylor Trang, Alexa Barnes, Amanda Rexhausen, Jana Tihista, and Freia Henz. Airien Ackerman, Madison Sibley, Scanlan, and Clampitt received an honorable mention on the 7th and 8th grade team test. "I am hoping more [students] will come out next year," said Ms. Canen speaking of the math contest.

All-Girl Team Represents NHS at Academic Olympics

During the oral rounds, the Porcupines made it to the semi-finals, but lost out with a possible ref job. Questions in the oral round included many different subjects to testing the Porcupines overall knowledge. "Overall, our girls competed really well and represented Nashua with grace and intelligence" said chaperone Marc Kloker.

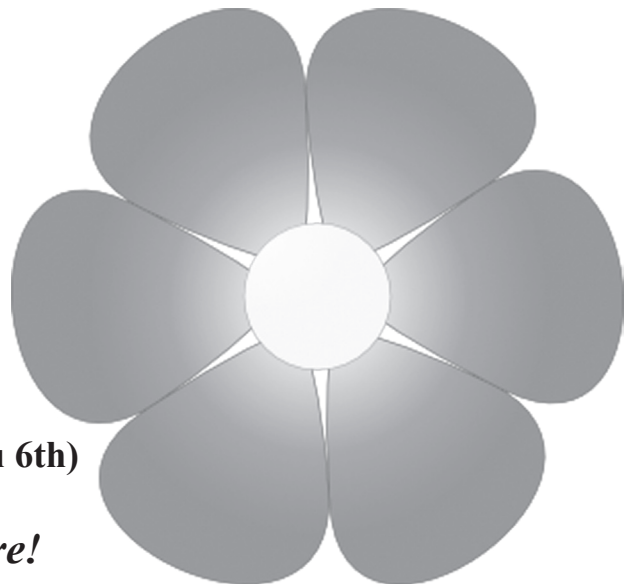
