



Volleyball Season Ends at Districts

The Lady Porcupines had a rough season, to say the least. Heading into districts, the Porcupines had a conference record of 3-8 and an overall record of 5-9. The girls were matched up with the eighth ranked team, the Froid-Medicine Lake Red Hawks. Nashua had played their best volleyball of the season against the Red-hawks, but the Porcupines came up short, losing 3-1 at the District 1-C Tournament at Sidney.

Nashua's loss dropped the team into the loser bracket to face the loser of Richey-Lambert and Culbertson. Richey-Lambert, surprisingly, defeated Culbertson in five games, which matched up the Porcupines with the Cowgirls.

The Porcupines had a tough loss to the Cowgirls, dropping all three games. The girls had to throw in new players and had to switch up the rotation against Culbertson.

Culbertson over Nashua, 25-12, 25-15, 25-8. The double elimination tournament sent the Porcupines home, ending their season for 2010.

Junior High Basketball Season Finishes

On November 20, the Nashua Porcupines went to Whitewater for the district tournament.

Nashua's junior high girls placed third, and the boys team finished fourth.

The Porcupine girls first played the Whitewater Penguins, losing 28-30. Leading scorers for the Porcupines were MyKayla Lauckner with 14, Shae Fisher with eight, Sandy Viste with five, and Jordan Ramsbacher with one.

Next, the girls took on the Frazer Bearcubs, beating them 39-16. Leading scores for the Porcupines were MyKayla Lauckner and Shae Fisher with 12 each, Chy Ann Clampitt had six, Jordan Ramsbacher finished with three, Faith Keys, Natasha Chamberlain, Ziggy Chamberlain all added two.

The girls then played Hinsdale/Saco and defeated them 19-8. Leading scorers for the Porcupines were Shae Fisher with seven, MyKayla Lauckner with six, Ziggy Chamberlain, Natasha Chamberlain, and Chy Ann all added two.

The boys dropped each of their games to Hinsdale/Saco and Whitewater .
