
Awards Assembly

The third quarter for the Porcupines was slow; they scored only 17, while the Bearcubs had 15. The Porcupines pulled ahead scoring 25 in the fourth to beat Frazer, 66-56. Leading scorers for the Porcupines were Willy Lauckner with 27, Brandon Hansard with 17, Sean Bengochea with 10, Jordan Sibley, and Anthony Bengochea each had five, while Jared Busch added two.
